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## Day One:

- 9:00** Start your morning at Darts Farm Shopping Village - voted Best Large Farm Shop in the UK. Browse through local food and drink produce to take home with you, then top the morning off with a hearty breakfast at the Darts Farm Café.
- 11:00** Head to Pebblebed Vineyards in Clyst St George to begin a winemaker tour and tasting session. Discover the wine-making process and get the chance to taste five Pebblebed wines!
- 12:30** Jump on a bus to Topsham, the place to be for a food fanatic! Take a stroll down the high street and spot the delightful independent shops, selling local food and drink to tickle the taste buds. If you're feeling peckish, Topsham isn't short of a café or two! Grab a quick bite to eat at the Route 2 Café or The Glasshouse at the Salutation Inn, before you head off to the next foodie stop of your trip.
- 17:00** A train will take you from Topsham to Exeter St David's Station, where you will arrive at Exeter Brewery after a 5 minute walk. Take a 40 minute guided tour, giving you an insight into how local beer is produced. Sit down and relax after the tour whilst you're served pie, mash and gravy along with many choices of Exeter Brewery ales!

## Day Two:

- 9:00** Visit Quicke's Farm just outside Exeter and embark on a tour which allows you to discover how they make their award-winning cheeses. Wander around the farm, browse within the cheese tour and stop off at The Beer Engine for a two-course lunch.
- 15:00** Arrive in the city centre and make your way down to Fore Street, the home of Exeter Farmer's Market. These friendly farmers and producers sell organic fruit and vegetables, a range of meats as well as cakes and pies!
- 18:00** Head to Queen St Dining or Princesshay for world cuisines and major brand restaurants, dine with a view of the magnificent Cathedral in Cathedral Yard, or head to some of Exeter's side streets for independent restaurants serving the best quality Devon produce.
- 20:00** Take a stroll down to Exeter's idyllic Quayside for a selection of independent bars and restaurants. Relax at Doctor Ink's Curiosities, for a cocktail experience like no other, or sample Exeter Gin at the Street Food Market in Piazza Terracina (selected dates only).

## Day Three:

- 9:30** Start your last day in Exeter on the beautiful historic Quayside, where you can take a cookery course of your choice at the friendly Exeter Cookery School. Learn how to make your own pasta, how to create tasty desserts for your dinner party and how to perfectly cook your favourite meat! Instead of bringing back a souvenir from your trip to Exeter, take home a valuable skill!
