Exeter is a compact city so you'll find it easy to navigate on foot, or join a Discover Exeter sightseeing bus tour, where you can hop on and off at all the main sights.



We've created this Unmissable Exeter itinerary, showcasing the city's top five must-see places to visit, so even if your time in Exeter is limited, you and your group won't miss a thing!

Morning:

9:00am

Visit Exeter's award-winning Royal Albert Memorial Museum (RAMM). Spend an hour here discovering the city's rich and fascinating history and culture from pre-historic times to the present day. Visit RAMM's café for a quick coffee and check out the gift shop to pick out a unique souvenir to take home with you.

10:30am

Visit Exeter Cathedral in the heart of the city. Join a guided tour to learn more about the history of the building from the experts. Don't miss the minstrels' gallery, the impressive organ and the astronomical clock, and be sure to look up to see the beautiful stained glass windows set under the longest stretch of unbroken Gothic vaulting in the world.

Afternoon:

12:00pm

Join a guided walking tour with Exeter's Red Coat Guides to discover more about the city's fascinating, and often turbulent 2,000 year history. Tours can be pre-booked for your group at a date and time to suit you.

1:00pm

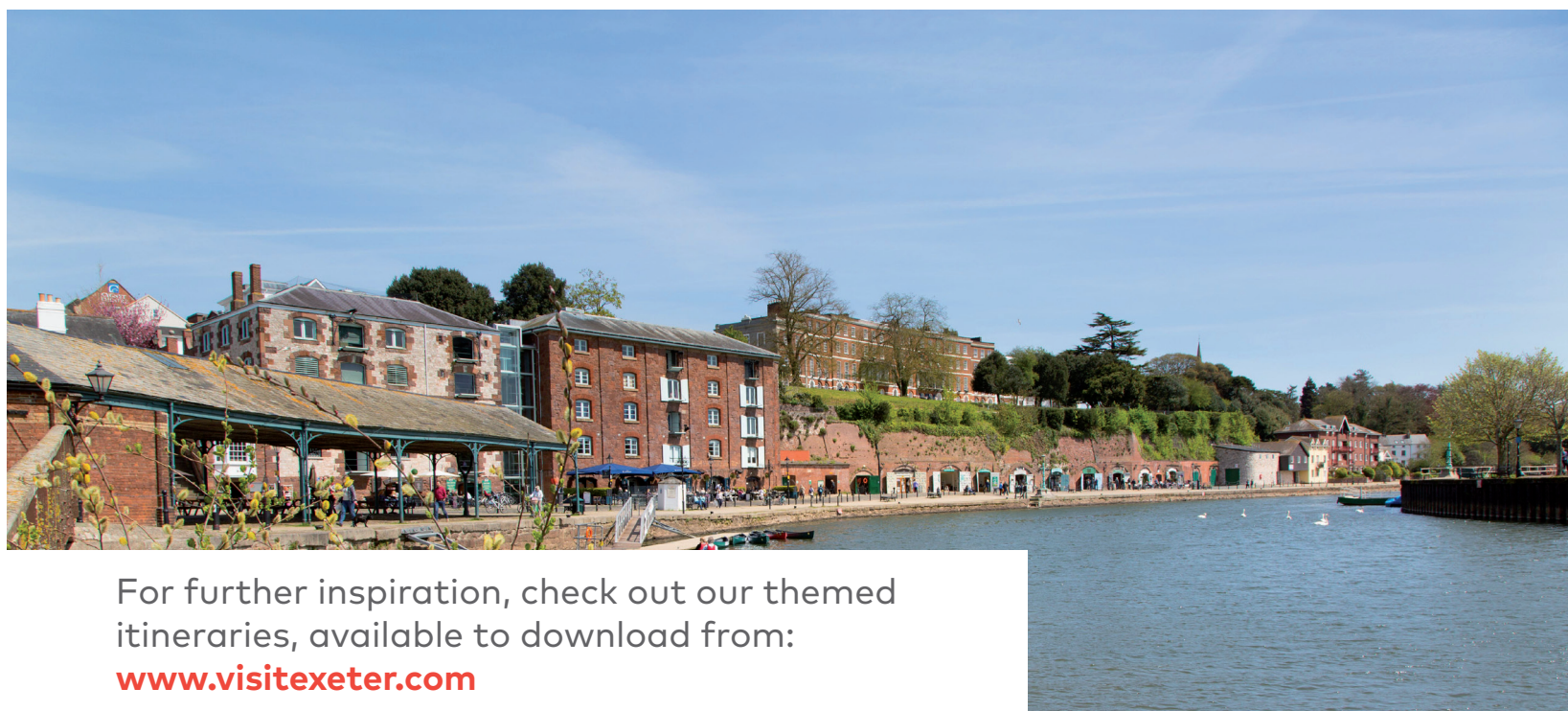
Exeter has a fantastic selection of places to eat and drink, with restaurants, pubs and cafés serving the best local Devon produce. Princesshay and Queen St Dining both offer a great choice of cuisines from around the world, or enjoy views of the Cathedral as you dine in splendour at The Ivy.

2:30pm

Book onto a tour at the fascinating Underground Passages, one of Exeter's most unusual visitor attractions. Dating from medieval times, these vaulted passageways were used to bring a supply of fresh drinking water into the city through lead pipes!

4:00pm

Arrive at Exeter's beautiful historic Quayside - a must when visiting Exeter. Here you can browse quirky shops housed in historic cellars and explore the Custom House Visitor Centre, before you finish your day with an evening meal at one of the waterside restaurants, such as On The Waterfront or Rockfish Exeter.
