## Alphin Brook Walk

Part of Exeter's Green Circle

The Exeter Green Circle is a twelve-mile walk around the outskirts of Exeter – from green countryside valley parks to the pavements of quiet leafy suburbs.

## A peaceful rural escape

This part of the Green Circle follows the valley of the Alphin Brook.

The upper section of the brook flows through rich agricultural land separated from the city by a ridge of hills.

As it reaches the Exe valley, the brook is tamed in a modern channel to prevent it flooding the old village of Alphington and its modern neighbour, the industrial estate of Marsh Barton.

Discover views and locations that are all part of Exeter but which often seem miles from a city.

## Points of interest

1 Little John's Cross
Granite boundary stone from the 15th century
placed by the Littlejohn family to mark their estate.

2 Twisted Oak

A 265+ year-old tree reached by a connecting footpath, giving its name to the nearby pub.

3 Roly Poly Hill

The fruit farm below benefits from this south facing slope.

4 Oaklands Riding School
Family-run riding school established over 50 years ago.

5 Alphington Church
A beautiful building dating from 1480.

6 Double Locks

The country's longest locks, fitting two ships at once ('double locks'). The pub here is great for waterside drinks.

7 Exeter & Devon Crematorium

14 acres of tranquil grounds, with meandering paths through an avenue of trees leading to the riverbank.
