Day One:

10:00

Arrive at the award-winning Royal Albert Memorial Museum to explore 16 galleries, including collections from around the world dating from pre-historic times to the present day. Don't forget to pop into the RAMM Café for a pit-stop and the Shop at RAMM for a souvenir to take home with you!

12:00

Treat yourself to a tasty lunch at an independent restaurant or café in Exeter, give Eat on the Green a try for heart-warming dishes with views of Exeter Cathedral!

13:30

Catch a matinee performance at Exeter Northcott Theatre, Cygnet Theatre or Exeter Barnfield. Whether you're after a drama, a comedy or a musical, the theatre scene in the city is bursting with choice!

16:00

Browse through collections at the Bill Douglas Cinema Museum at the University of Exeter, which houses the largest collection of items relating to the moving image. You'll have the opportunity to explore toys, artefacts and memorabilia from the seventeenth century to the present day.

17:30

Visit the historic Turk's Head pub on the High Street for dinner, a key part of Exeter's nightlife, food and culture.

19:30

Arrive at the Exeter Corn Exchange just as the doors open to your evening show. This popular venue hosts various events from music, to comedy to dance!

Day Two:

All Day

Exeter is designated a UNESCO City of Literature. Explore some of its important literary connections with the Exeter Literary Map. Visit Exeter Cathedral to see the Exeter Book, perhaps Exeter's greatest treasure, or spend time exploring the historic collection of books at the Devon and Exeter Institution.

Visit the Custom House on Exeter Quayside, which is a literature hub for the Quay Words project, an exciting programme that explores stories and writing.
