Exeter has officially been named one of the UK's top 10 cities for dining out! There is a huge choice of places to eat and drink here, from small independents showcasing the best local Devon produce, to international cuisines from almost every corner of the world.



Day One:

9:00

Nothing beats a hearty breakfast to fuel up for the day ahead and Eat on the Green serve up an array of English classics, with stunning views of Exeter Cathedral. If you like your eggs then be prepared for a fantastic choice, served on a toasted English muffin with Hollandaise sauce.

11:00

From here it's just a short stroll to Exeter Central rail station, where you can catch a train for a 15 minute journey to Topsham, alongside the River Exe. This quaint historic port town is an absolute foodie's delight.

From Topsham's station, build up your appetite with a stroll to Darts Farm Shopping Village, where you'll find the freshest, local produce from our corner of the country. Browse the colourful farm shop and stop for a coffee in the Cow & Cacao Cafe, where you can try delicious homemade treats.

13:00

Walk back to Topsham for lunch at the 18th-century Passage House Inn, which has picturesque views across the River Exe Estuary. After lunch have a wander around Topsham, where you'll discover many more independent eateries, shops and the opportunity to buy direct from local producers.

Catch a train back to Exeter and enjoy the scenery whilst you make plans for dinner. For a relaxed and sophisticated dining experience then The Ivy Exeter presents an extensive menu and is beautifully located overlooking Exeter Cathedral.

20:00

After dinner it's time to explore Exeter's nightlife, with a great choice of pubs and bars. The Turk's Head, one of the region's oldest and most unique pubs, pours a selection of beers and ales produced in their on-site micobrewery while a former hospital houses the rather quirky Cosy Club where you'll find plenty of creative and classic cocktails to end the night on.

Day Two:

10:00

Exeter is renowned for its independent cafe culture, so you'll be spoilt for choice of places to visit for coffee or brunch. A local favourite is the very Instagrammable Arrietty's, where you can buy fine coffee, beautiful flowers, delicious food and bakes!

12:00

Take a wander to Magdalen Road, Exeter's village street in the heart of the city, named one of the '10 coolest shopping areas in the whole world' by The Guardian. Browse the independent shops and delis for locally sourced goods to make up a picnic, which you can enjoy in one of the city's beautiful green spaces.

14:00

Take part in a brewery experience at the Turks Head, where you can join the brewers in their on-site micro-brewery to find out what happens behind the scenes!

18:00

For those with a big appetite then head to On the Waterfront and indulge in their famous dust-bin lid pizzas or head to Crave for a relaxed dining experience with a surf and turf vibe.

For sunset drinks then Exeter Quayside is the place to be and during the summer months look out for events and live music, including Jazz on the Quay to soundtrack your lazy Sunday afternoons.
