4.	The dragon number 5 is part of a larger statue, other than one of the figures looking like James Bond (Daniel Craig), what else is unusual about this statue?
	Bonus question – which figure looks like James Bond?
5.	The Wyvern, creature number 6 was used for target practice, but during which war?
6.	What is the name of the building where you found the Pegasus? What is the building used for?
7.	What is creature number 8 called?
8.	What is the name of the street where you found the Dragon number 11? Why do you think the street is called this?
