These FREE guided walking tours operate daily throughout the year, offering a wide range from which to choose.

Meet your Red Coat Guide and discover historic Exeter for yourself.

Tours need to be booked in advance by 4pm the previous day and are restricted to only 5 people.

All tours start promptly, and last approximately 90 minutes.

Tours will only go ahead with a minimum of two people on the tour.

Tour Descriptions

Cathedral to Quay • Monday at 11am and Friday at 11am

Starting in the picturesque Cathedral Close, proceed into elegant Southernhay before viewing the impressive city wall. The tour then continues to the River Exe and finishes on Exeter's Historic Quayside.

Exeter's Historic Quayside • Tuesday at 11am

Discover the port of Exeter, once one of Britain's busiest, and hear about its fascinating history. Stroll out and back along the river and canal. This tour starts and finishes outside the Custom House Visitor Centre on Exeter Quay.

Medieval Exeter • Wednesday at 11am and Saturday at 11am

This tour celebrates the time when Exeter grew rich from the woollen cloth trade. See many of the surviving medieval buildings, including 'the House that Moved', then walk across the Medieval Exe Bridge to view the restored Cricklepit Mill. The tour finishes on Exeter's Historic Quayside.

Forgotten Exeter • Thursday at 11am

Be intrigued by hidden corners and curios of the city, long since gone from memory. The tour is focused on the north west corner of the city within the city walls. The tour finishes on Fore Street.

Ghosts & Legends • Thursday at 7pm

Exeter is reputed to be of one of the most haunted cities in the country. Hear chilling stories about many of the historic buildings within the city. Suitable for all ages.

Exeter Old & New • Sunday at 11am

Discover the history of Exeter from pre-Roman times to the present day. Visit the 11th century Castle Gatehouse, probably Britain's oldest surviving Norman building, and Northernhay Gardens, the first public garden in the country. The tour finishes outside the historic Guildhall.

Special Tour

Exeter Blitz • Tuesday 4 May at 2pm, 2.15pm & 2.30pm

Discover how Exeter was affected by the air raids of 4 May 1942. Find out about the devastating Baedeker raids on this annual commemoration and how this event shaped the city we see today.
