

# Redhills Walk

## Part of Exeter's Green Circle

Length: ~2 Miles | Duration: 45 minutes

### THE EXETER GREEN CIRCLE

The Exeter Green Circle is a twelve-mile walk around the outskirts of Exeter – from green countryside valley parks to the pavements of quiet leafy suburbs.

The walk has five sections as shown on the full route map below.



## Leafy hills and river views

The Redhills Walk explores the green areas and viewpoints in Redhills and the western fringes of Exeter.

There are one or two steep climbs along this route – notably between the River Exe flood plain, with its allotments and playing fields, and these leafy hills. The Millers Crossing bridge over the Exe is one of the highlights of the walk, especially when the river is high.

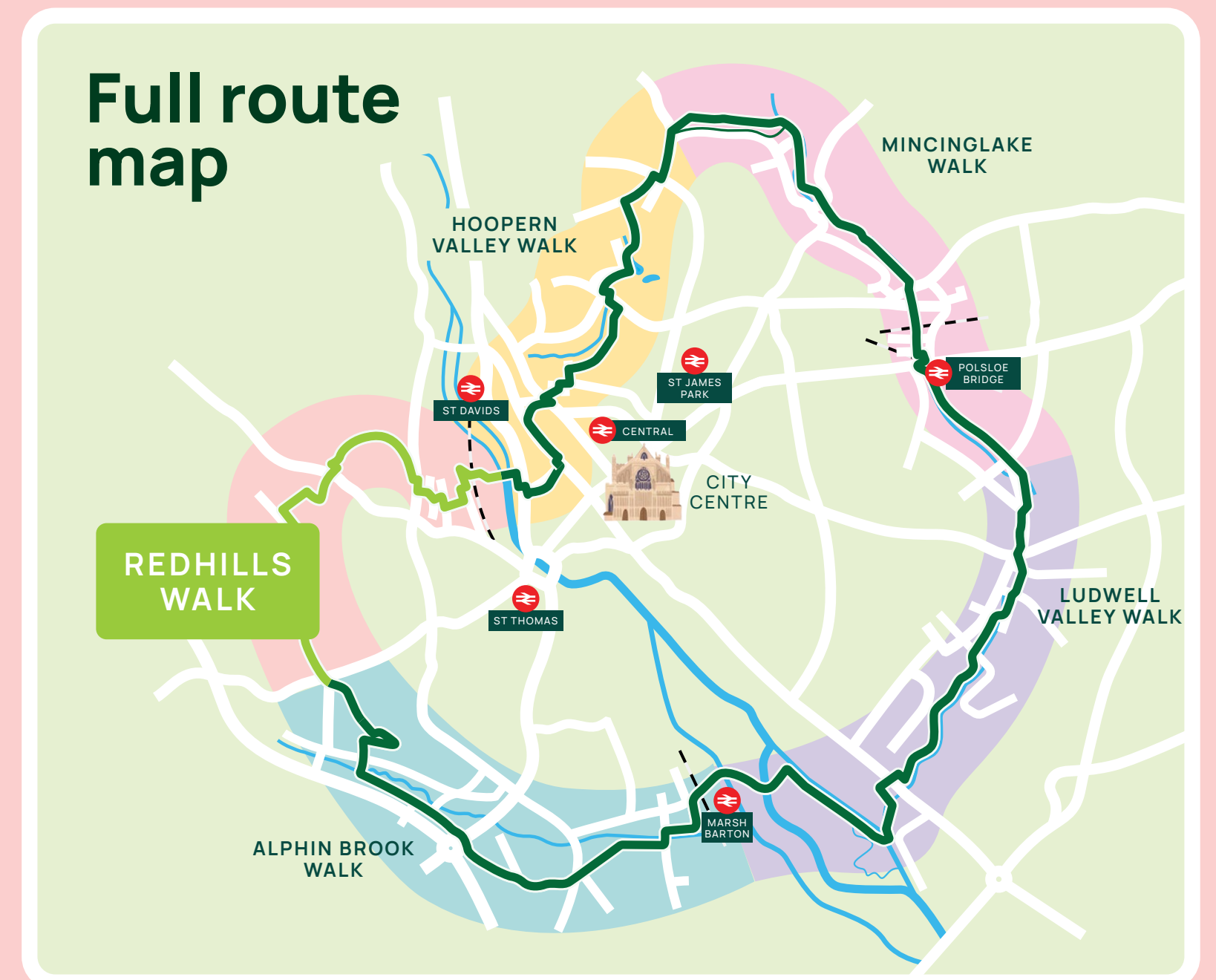
### Points of interest

- 1 Millers Crossing**  
Spans the River Exe above Blackaller Weir. You may see salmon leaping on their way to spawn on Exmoor.
- 2 Flowerpot Playing Fields**  
Home to Exeter's largest skatepark, a state-of-the-art concrete surfaced facility that was designed by Exeter skaters, riders and boarders.
- 3 Exwick Sports Pavilion**  
A sports hub owned by Exeter College, with playing fields, rugby and football pitches, including a full size 3G astro turf pitch and tennis facilities.
- 4 Exwick Cemetery**  
This historic cemetery opened in 1877. The walk takes you on a steep woodland climb through Cemetery Field, a former brickpit.
- 5 Barley Valley Local Nature Reserve**  
This western ridge line of the city has splendid rural valleys and offers excellent views of the city. Watch for buzzards, foxes and woodpeckers.

### Map key
